## Military and Standard Time

Military time (24-hour time) is exclusively used in hospitals. Suppose a hospital physician writes an order for a medication to be given at 4:00. Since hospitals care for acutely ill people, medications are given around the clock. So, is this medication to be given at 4:00 AM or 4:00 PM? The use of military time solves this problem.

Military time uses a 24 hour clock rather than the standard 12 hour clock. On a standard clock, 4:00 AM looks exactly like 4:00 PM. The advantage of using military time is that no two times during a 24 hour day are the same. Assuming the day begins at 12:01 AM, (in military time, this is 0001 hours) and the day ends at 12:00 midnight (in military time, this is 2400 hours), there are a total of 24 hours in between. Look at the table below to see how military time corresponds to standard time during that 24 hour period.
