Where do I find sources?” ; and “A List of Sources at OCC Library” (I&amp;C 140+).</p> <p>Then, using the <u>UPerspectives</u> textbook, library’s databases, or other holdings in our library, email me the author, title, and source of two essays that you’re considering using in your own essay.</p>
T 4/22	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Bring in article connected to civic stances (see HW#18 above)</li> <li>• Read and annotate “Parts of an Evaluative Essay” (I&amp;C 98)</li> <li>• (Time: 20 min.) Read and annotate “Peer Review Essay #3” (105).</li> <li>• Using the work you’ve done in class, your notes, the Reasons and Evidence sheet, the many suggestions in “Basic Drafting Plan essay #3 (I&amp;C 99), write out a rough draft of essay #3.
