QUIARA ALEGRÍA HUDES is

the author of Water by the Spoonful, winner of the 2012 Pulitzer Prize for Drama. Water by the Spoonful is the second in a trilogy of plays. The first, Elliot, A Soldier's Fugue, was a finalist for the Pulitzer Prize in 2007. The third and final installment, The Happiest Song Plays Last, opens at the Goodman Theatre in Chicago in April 2013.

Hudes wrote the book for the Broadway musical In the Heights, which received the 2008 Tony Award for Best Musical and was a 2009 Pulitzer Prize finalist. Other works include Barrio

Grrrl!, a children's musical that premiered at the Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts in 2009 and toured nationally, 26 Miles, and her first play, Yemaya's Belly.
