## For paragraph 3: "What should I have in it?"

- Topic sentence: make sure divisions are an idea instead of an example
- Frame argument: explain idea. Explain, in general, how your idea connects to the thesis; might need to add a definition.

Example: in a paragraph about how gender bias negatively effects law enforcement, you'd have to define what you mean by gender bias, and then how, in general, it could hurt law enforcement.

- Examples from play: set up examples by providing context before inserting them. See "Introducing Quotes" on Course Documents
- Explanation: how and why example/quote proves the point of the paragraph. Might refer back to word/idea from framing. Remember: repetition can be your friend.
- Conclude: wrap up loose ends "knot it."
