A1. Hyflex Experiences from Teacher and Student Perspectives (Panel)

These changes were not set in motion by the pandemic — and they certainly won't be discontinued when we move past the current health crisis — because the marriage of technology and pedagogy as the future of education has been evident for years. It can't be denied, however, that the sudden "change-up" to virtual from face-to-face instruction jettisoned many of us into that future without much warning! 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This presentation introduces the START model developed in 2016 as a novel collaborative teaching method for science students. This model can be applied for online and on-ground teaching. START, an acronym for "(S)yllabus Analysis, (T)racking System Covering Objectives, (A)ssessment Methods, (R)esearch Component Inclusion, (T)esting Through Research," is presented as a unique method for educators to improve the current academic standards by placing a priority on multidisciplinary approaches.
